**Needs Assessment:** A knowledge gap analysis concerning educational activities on the gut microbiome and the use of probiotics for pharmacists reveals a critical need for enhanced understanding and training in this area. Given the growing body of research highlighting the importance of gut microbiota in health and disease, pharmacists play a crucial role in educating patients and providing appropriate interventions. However, many pharmacists may lack comprehensive knowledge about the gut microbiome and probiotics, including their mechanisms of action, therapeutic indications, and potential interactions with medications.
